 4. You understand that bees are wild insects and it is possible for your child to be stung.
 5. You understand that you will provide the Sunflower Extension District #6 with the proper documents (insurance, medical release forms, & parent signature) to have your child treated in case of a bee sting that requires medical attention.
 6. You understand that the your child should not eat banana's on the day of the bee tour. Turns out bananas contain a compound called isoamyl acetate (also known as isopentyl acetate) – the very same as that which is in honeybees' alarm pheromone.
